HISTORY

In 1991, three city managers from Alhambra, Monrovia and West Covina recognized the need for a regional entity for the purpose of advocating, marketing, and expanding the economic base of the San Gabriel Valley. These city managers and several private sector business leaders came together to create the San Gabriel Valley Commerce and Cities Consortium to leverage the power of the region and to promote the valley.

A few years later in 1998, the group's name was changed to the San Gabriel Valley Economic Partnership to reflect the growing and broad membership including business, local government, colleges and universities and non-profit organizations committed to the mission of advancing the economic vitality and quality of life of the San Gabriel Valley.

Since that time, we have strived to advance the region as an economic, logistic, educational, medical, manufacturing, and cultural hub of Southern Caliofrnia.


BUSINESS ASSISTANCE

The Business Assistance Program (BAP) Team continues to support the recovery and resiliency of the San Gabriel Valley Region's business community from the pandemic slowdown through Layoff Aversion, Business Technical Assistance, Together for LA, CMTC and other programs and resources. The team is addressing business challenges and opportunities with prioritized outreach to minority, women and BIPOC-owned businesses. The BAP team continues to help to City of Monterey Park and City of Montebello businesses following their business disruptions.

- The team provided direct technical business assistance and in-person consultation to 231 businesses during the 2022-2023 fiscal year by helping small and diverse-owned businesses sustain their operations using or recommending a variety of programs and resources to assist them.
- The BAP team continues to support small and microenterprises including but not limited to women-

- owned, Black-owned, veteran-owned and Latinx-owned businesses.
- In FY22-23, the BAP Team played a pivotal role in numerous task forces, MADIA, special meetings and presenting or participating in small business expos or resource fairs. The California Association for Local Economic Development (CALED) hosted their annual conference in Los Angeles in June. The BAP team was able to provide conference scholarships to two San Gabriel Valley Cities.

The BAP Team continues virtual and in-person meetings and roundtable convenings with business owners and partners conducting needs assessments, technical assistance and other consultations to encourage business participation in the Economic Opportunity Grants program and other COVID-19 and financial assistance programs.



WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Workforce Development Committee

The San Gabriel Valley Economic Partnership established a Workforce Development Committee to bring together the Partnership's education and private sector members to aid in creating workforce opportunities locally. The Committee is co-chaired by Salvatrice Cummo, Vice President of Economic and Workforce Development at Pasadena City College, and Angela Bernacki, Chief People Officer at Emanate Health, Human Resources. The first meeting was held on Thursday, April 27, 2023 at Pasadena City College with a lens on the Healthcare sector. Meetings will be held quarterly.



Celebrating Engineering Week

This February's winter storm did not stop an epic journey to Fresno from happening in honor of Engineering Week. This once in a lifetime opportunity gave 32 Career Technical Education (CTE) students affiliated with the K12 Foothill Consortium the chance to travel to Fresno State University to tour the Lyles College of Engineering and to visit the California High–Speed Rail Authority Central Valley Project on February 23 and 24, 2023. Consortium engineering academies and pathway programs are based out of Azusa, Charter Oak and Monrovia High Schools. This was our first blended trip.

Ninth- through twelfth-grade CTE students toured the Lyles College of Engineering and main campus. Fresno State engineering students hosted a Q&A panel, explaining geomatics engineering, time management techniques and more. "The Lyles College of Engineering and the California High Speed Rail Authority make great collaboration partners," said Amy Foell, Workforce Development Consultant at the San Gabriel Valley Economic Partnership. "They understand the immense payoff quality work-based learning experiences can be for youth. The consortium made an intentional effort to have in-person, high impact experiences for CTE students. Exposure, exposure, exposure – whether it be a worksite tour or the onramps leading to engineering and construction management careers."

Friday morning, they traveled to the Authority's Central California Regional Office to learn more about construction in Central Valley and career opportunities for students interested in careers as engineers on the project. The Authority staff provided a project overview, and the students met with a variety of staff members during the professional panel which included a bus tour of the San Joaquin River and Cedar viaducts, and a lunch-and-learn with project engineers that detailed information about grade separations, concrete, and bridge developments. The K12 Foothill Consortium is the first group from southern California schools to visit the future Fresno station site. We plan to make this an annual adventure for our engineering programs.

Digital Pathways Collaborations

Monrovia High's Digital Studies Academy gained hands-on 3D scaling and modeling experience with Dionysus Creative utilizing a digital scanning camera. The end product features the Monrovia Historical Society's Anderson House virtual tour.

This collaboration will continue with the Monrovia Historical Society, Dionysus Creative and Monrovia High CTE. These digital assets will then be developed into immersive experiences allowing for eternal preservation. Students gain hands on training with advanced technologies such as Lidar and Photogrammetry Scanning, and softwares used in gaming, VR, AR, film, television, and other forms of visual storytelling.

Girls Fire Camp in Pasadena

The Pasadena Fire Department launched their first Girls' Fire Camp for ages 14 – 18 years of age. Gladstone Medical Academy students were invited to learn what it's like to be a firefighter, gaining hands-on skills training alongside female firefighters from the Pasadena Fire Department.

K12 Foothill Consortium 2023 Summer Internship Program

The K12 Foothill Consortium is in its 4th summer, offering internship experiences for high school career technical education students. This summer, 50 students ranging in 10–12th grades hail from across the Azusa, Charter Oak, Duarte, and Monrovia Unified School Districts.

Interns are expected to attend the workforce readiness trainings hosted by the San Gabriel Valley Economic Partnership before starting a summer internship. This year featured our very first Internship and Employment Fair. Students interviewed with prospective summer hosts. All students received course credit through their affiliated district and a scholarship for participation through the San Gabriel Valley Foundation for Economic Growth.

All in for Azusa

The San Gabriel Valley Economic Partnership delivers free employment bootcamps across industry sectors for those seeking a career transition. All bootcamps take place on the grounds of Memorial Park in the City of Azusa.

October 25, 2022, in collaboration with the Industry Business Council and All in For Azusa hosted a Manufacturing Employment Bootcamp. The event targeted veterans and anyone 18 years of age or older seeking a reliable income with benefits. Coaches were available to assist with open positions and to review resumes. Local manufacturers discussed their important mission to grow manufacturing innovation across the San Gabriel Valley.

On April 22, the Partnership hosted a Federal Law Enforcement Bootcamp at the CommUNITY Festival in



Azusa. Free and open to the public, participants learned about the on-ramps and opportunities for a career in public service. Officer Michael Vigil presented the step-by-step process and offered his guidance moving forward to all participants.

On June 27, the Partnership hosted a Healthcare Employment Bootcamp with local senior care facilities such as Brookdale and others. Participants tested their skills with medical soft skills modules resume feedback and a local employer panel discussion with Q&A.

Career Training Events

The City of Azusa and the K12 Foothill Consortium hosts regular sessions for job-seekers and those fresh on the market to hone their resume and interviewing skills, and also to make direct connections to potential employers. These meetings are coordinated by the Partnership and take place at the Azusa Community Resource Center.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

In November 2022, the Partnership launched an Economic Development Committee to convene city staff and strategically chosen business leaders to discuss the key issues facing economic progress. Our intial two meetings included 40 to 60 staff members who shared concerns and best practices. The June 6, 2023 meeting featured Gurbax Sahota, CEO of the California Association for Local

Economic Development, as a special guest speaker. The City of South Pasadena hosted the first gathering at their historic City Library. The second meeting was graciously hosted by Tournament House in Pasadena, home of the Tournament of Roses. Future meetings will focus on hot button items such as the Surplus Land Act and other issues facing cities in the San Gabriel Valley.

2022 Housing Summit

The Partnership, the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments, and Presenting Sponsor National CORE convened a discussion on November 16, 2022, to discuss of where the housing market is, how we got here, and what can be done for the future. A special emphasis was put on workforce housing that can keep our region moving forward as a major economic engine for the country.


